Furthermore, 88 percent of the youth enrolled into our mentoring program graduate high school to enter post secondary education. Our mission, Uproot the inherited issues of our older generations to cure the prolonged problems in today's youth. Founded in 2011 as a direct result of the acquiescence of youth underachieving scholastically in addition to their learned violent behavior and poor morale within in South Florida.

Featured COVID-19 Projects'

Generational Cure along with its partners, Miami Dolphins, YWCA and Mastercard offered financial literacy and mental health workshops during the COVID-19 pandemic. Police departments of City of Miramar, City of Miami Gardens and the City of Miami, contributed key data that allowed mental health professionals to articulate on unprecedented issues, due to quarantine and offer follow up services to those in attendance. In order to ensure that the alarming shortage of food was remedied, Generational Cure partnered with Farm Share, Miami Dolphins and the Trayvon Martin Foundation to distribute groceries and prepped meals to the community. Unfortunately, parents and children expressed their concerns as the holidays approached during 2020, therefore, former Commissioner of District 1, Barbara Jordan, Toy's for Tots and 34 Ways assisted with solidifying toys for the community. Ultimately, our greatest contributions during the pandemic has been the ability to honor "Extraordinary Youth," during our 5th annual Black & White Gala in 2021. This event was necessary beyond the fact that many of the youth were from underserved communities. They were honorees while most schools weren't recognizing any students for their diligence during such a time. All of the events were free to the community. During the pandemic Generational Cure has been able to secure strategic partnerships to successfully deliver several mental health community enrichment initiatives surrounding the unprecedented issues presented by COVID-19.



- Evidence based questionnaire within the municipalities of Miami Gardens, City of Miramar and City of Miami prompted the virtual mental health community enrichment initiatives.
- The virtual initiatives covered such in home dangers during the quarantine as: domestic violence, child safety, anxiety, depression and the concern of financial literacy.
- Professionals that contributed to these virtual community enrichment initiatives provided follow up services to those in attendance.
- Several food distributions including a weekly initiative.
- A drive through toy giveaway for Miami Gardens, Miramar and City of Miami.
